Willowwood Foundation Lilac Party 2018

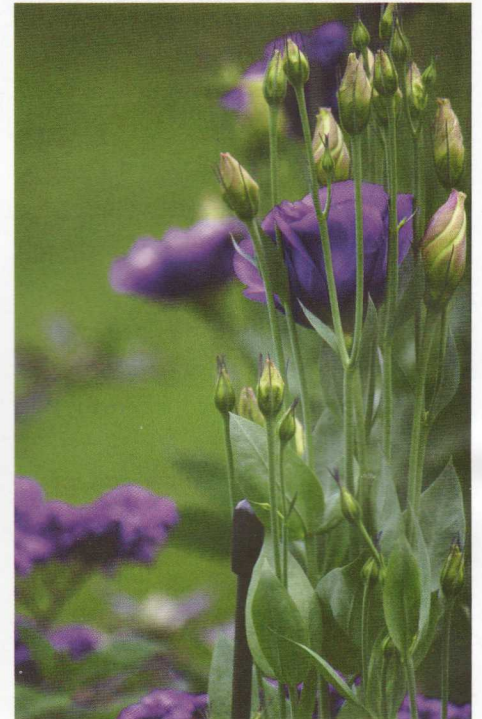
